Keurboom ensures that the fight against cancer continues, even for those that have nothing.

The cost for both workshops including Vat will be R220.

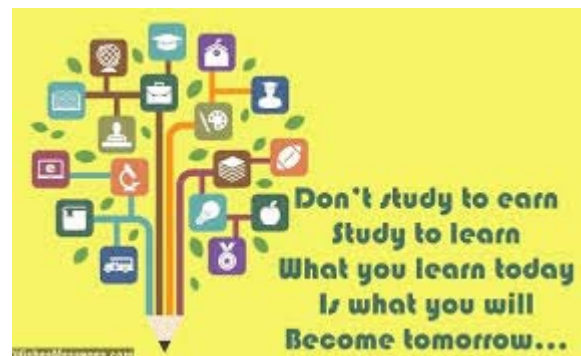
As this workshop is imperative to improve learner academic achievement, R110 will be debited to the school fee account at the end of May and a further R110 will be debited at the end of June.
